

Infrastructure

Flight connections

Finland offers the fastest route between Europe and Asia. With 27 airports, five of which are international, there are direct flights from many European, American and Asian cities.

Ferry connections

There is frequent international passenger and cargo traffic from Helsinki and Turku. Helsinki has ferry connections to Germany (Travemünde, Rostock), Poland (Gdynia), Sweden (Stockholm) and Estonia (Tallinn).




SNOW COVERAGE

ANNUAL DAYS OF SNOW

In Lapland, winter lasts for approximately half the year. The first snow falls already in September and the first snow cover appears in October. A permanent blanket of snow covers the ground usually by November. In Southern Finland, the snowy season is shorter. In some places, it might even remain completely snow-free.

Fringes & Basic Facts

Shooting permits

- To these rates you will have to add social security rates at +23%.
- Normal working hours are 8 hours per day, 5 days a week 40 hours), Monday to Friday.
- 10-hour days are most common.
- A lunch break is mandatory when working at least 6 hours. Lunch is a minimum of 30 minutes and a maximum of 1 hour, and added on top of work time, along with two 10-minute coffee breaks.
- The first two (9th and 10th) extra hours are paid at time and a half. The following hours (11th ->) are paid double.
- You can directly calculate 10-hour day salaries by adding 37.5% to the 8-hour salary.
- The first 8 hours of the 6th and 7th working days of the week are paid at time and a half, and the following hours are paid double.
- The minimum hours for rest: 11 hours/day and 35 hours/week. But it is possible to work in periods that allow for more flexibility.

No permits are required for filming in public places. Filming on private property requires a permit either from the owner or from city authorities. Permit costs are usually very low.

A permit from the police is needed if filming requires special traffic arrangements (i.e. rerouting or stopping traffic). Filming of artworks (objects) protected by copyright law requires the consent of the copyright owner unless the works are publicly accessible and not the main focus of filming.

> Filming in Finland is simple thanks to the Everyman's Right principle. This allows everyone free access to land and waterways without having to go through the process of applying for a permit or separate permission. However, a landowner's permission is required for filming on private property or land.

Working permits

The right to perform gainful employment in Finland is determined according to citizenship.

It is the employer's obligation to ensure that a foreign citizen entering service and employment has the required worker's residence permit or that the foreign citizen does not need a residence permit.

EU/ETA citizens are entitled to work in Finland without a worker's residence permit. Citizens of countries outside the EEA are usually required to have a worker's residence permit. More information is available from the Employment and Economic Development Office.



Fast and simple: The Finnish 25% cash rebate

Business Finland offers a 25% cash rebate to cover production costs in Finland. The incentive is available to Finnish and foreign production companies from pre to post-production. It is targeted at feature films, documentary films, scripted fiction series and animation productions. A Finnish co-producer is not mandatory for international applicants, only a production service coordinator with a Finnish business ID is require.

All applicants are required to have a distribution agreement for at least one platform or one territory. Ongoing applications. First come, first served basis. Annual budget is €10 million. Qualifying costs in Finland are local expenditure. Payment of funding possible during production.

Co-production funding

International co-productions are also eligible for production support from The Finnish Film Foundation if a Finnish co-producer is involved. The foundation funds around 8 to 10 minority co-productions every year with a support budget of around €1 million. The amount of production support for minority co-productions has traditionally ranged from €25,000 to €500,000, depending on the Finnish creative/technical input. There are no spend requirements for the support, nor is the support recoupable. Regional production support is also available, and film commissions can offer links to private equity.

Support eligibility for co-productions is determined according to the following criteria:

- Involvement of a Finnish co-producer with Finnish distribution rights
- Artistic and/or technical input from Finland
- Distribution of the project in Finland
- Relevance of the project for Finnish audiences
- Possibilities for an ongoing co-operation between the parties
